We know many of you may have students that have gone on to college since graduating and we are hopeful that their college experience has been filled with great triumphs and that they are being prepared for future success. WHAT IS ACT-SO?

ACT-SO, a program by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), is an acronym that stands for Afro-Academic, Cultural, Technological and Scientific Olympics. It is a student enrichment program that culminates in a local and national competition where students compete for awards, and prizes totaling over \$50,000.

ACT-SO, often referred to as the "Olympics of the Mind", seeks to promote the following among high school students of African-American descent:

- Positive self-esteem
- Positive interaction between our youth and the adult professional community
- Positive academic and artistic excellence
- High academic and cultural achievement

The ACT-SO program centers around the dedication and commitment of community volunteers and business leaders; to serve as mentors and coaches to promote academic and artistic excellence among students of African-American descent.

Students, who participate in ACT-SO, compete with other students (locally) in up to 3 of 26 categories which include sciences, humanities, performing arts, visual arts and business. The local competition serves to showcase the hard work students have put in all year long. Students receive medals and prizes provided by the local and regional sponsors and contributors. ACT-SO Students who receive gold medals on the local level then compete at the National Competition where they receive prizes and other rewards provided by national sponsors.

The benefits ACT-SO students receive from the enrichment and mentorship components include substantial assistance toward the development of their ACT-SO projects and valuable tools to assist them throughout their education.

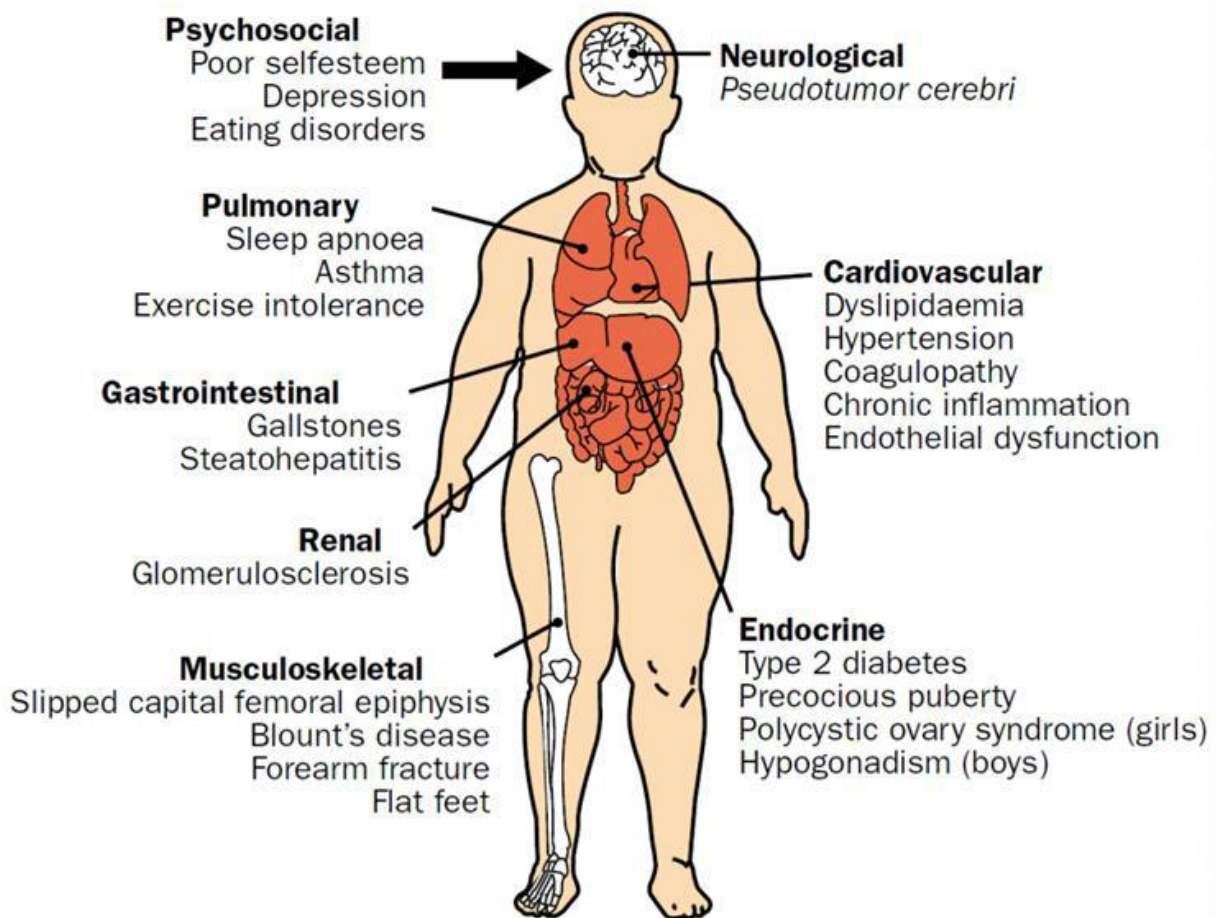

Why has Childhood obesity tripled in the past 30 years???

“Today, about one in three American kids and teens is overweight or obese, nearly triple the rate in 1963. Among children today, obesity is causing a broad range of health problems that previously weren’t seen until adulthood. These include high blood pressure, type 2 diabetes and elevated blood cholesterol levels. There are also psychological effects: Obese children are more prone to low self-esteem, negative body image and depression. And excess weight at young ages has been linked to higher and earlier death rates in adulthood.” This information is reported by the American Heart Association.

113 For Urban Education

113 is a simple concept – Scholars in the Kansas City area schools spend 55 hours per week in the classroom, going to and from schools, and spending a couple of hours after school in school-sanctioned activities such as sports, clubs, or programs. The rest of the 113 hours a week, our scholars spend in their homes, their neighborhood, and their city – on the streets, in a house, in recreational or community-based venues, in commercial areas, in churches, and wherever else they happen to be. It is during those 113 hours that we, as a community can affect our scholars and their preparedness to learn and achieve during the 55 hours they spend under the supervision of their school district.

What are we doing to ensure that scholars are being supported during their 113 hours? Are they safe? Are they calm and sleeping well? Are they nourished in body and spirit? Are they able to play, create, think, and enjoy? If the answer is no, then they are not ready to take advantage of the 55 hours of education they are receiving. They will not be able to focus, they will not be able to give full attention, they will not be able to see their future as possibilities rather than as something pre-destined to keep them where they currently are.

113 for Urban Education is a nonprofit organization that is seeking 501(c)4 status – allowing us to lobby on political issues and endorse political candidates. We are an advocacy group, not a political action committee. We intend to advocate for our scholars to have the best 113 hours a week possible in order to enhance their 55 hours of school environment learning.
